Performing Service

Courage

I came into DA 15 years ago because once again my situation with credit cards was starting to get out of control again. I had paid off my debt when I sold my house and swore never, never to get into debt again. That lasted until my car broke down, which was about one month. I had known about DA, and now it was time for me to go.

I had been told all my life that I was dumb because I had learning defects, and they didn't know anything about that when I was growing up back in the '60s. I could not add two plus two, and I didn't think I could ever grasp the meat of the program. With the help of my PRG and talking to many people and seeing how they did the program, I finally got the courage to try it. After a few years, I really got good at it.

I belong to another 12 step program. One of my meetings was in need of a treasurer, and I was nominated. I did this successfully for several years because the meeting was going through some changes, and there was no one else there to take on the position. I then served on this program's Intergroup and was asked to be a treasurer. I instantly said "no" because I could not add. Well, the way my higher power works, about a year later, I was at another Intergroup meeting and again they needed a treasurer. I prayed to my HP and asked him to show me the way. At the very next meeting, when the topic of needing a treasurer came up. my hand went up. I was shocked, and I took a big gulp. I successfully did that treasury for 1 1/2 years and was thanked when I was done for doing such a good job.

This gave me the courage to do treasury for a DA group, and again that went very well.

Today I have no problem with doing someone else's money because I can understand what I am doing. And if I don't, today I know how to ask for help rather than trying to figure it out myself.

Other services I do in DA, are PRGs. I have two for myself because I am a business owner, and I also have a personal one. I then give PRGs. Right now I am doing about 6 PRGs and every once in a while I give a one timer for someone. I also sponsor a few people, and I find that sponsoring and being a sponsee, is a win-win situation. I always get more than I give in these situations.

Last night at my Sunday night meeting, we read the pamphlet on service, and it mentioned about being almost addicted to doing service. That is something that I must look at constantly. If I start doing too much service, and I start to build up resentments, then I better stop and take a look at what I am doing wrong and set about to correct it. That usually means that I am people pleasing, which is one of my character defects. I then get to make an amends and correct the wrong I have made.

I am very grateful for the lessons I have learned in DA and am no longer afraid of money.

Surprising Benefits

At the encouragement of a friend, I started attending DA meetings and quite frankly did so only to support her. I paid my bills and didn't feel in debt, but I did have money issues and lived paycheck to paycheck. By listening to the shares, I quickly came to realize that this group was of value to me.

But I still did not completely understand the program. All those terms (PRG, GSR, Intergroup) and all that 12 stuff (Steps, Traditions, Promises, Tools) were bewildering. It took me months to realize that using a credit card was considered unsecured debt! After all, I paid my monthly minimum. I paid my bills. I was under the illusion that using a credit card was a natural and grown-up thing to do!

Then a situation occurred. Week after week. meeting after meeting, it was announced that a treasurer was needed, and no one volunteered. I started to get annoyed and thought, "What is the big deal? You take the money, write down the amounts in the register, take the money to the bank and pay the rent." It seemed simple to me. Although I was relatively new, I volunteered, and because I did not satisfy all the requirements yet, I was voted in through a group conscience. I successfully held the position for more than the 6 month term until I realized that for the group's health, I needed to end this part of my service and allow and require another to step into the position. I, of course, learned that being Treasurer is not a simple issue for many in DA. Yet the initial impulse to volunteer started me on a path of service.

Being responsible to the group made me look at the steps to be more responsible to myself. And, a very

unexpected thing happened. When I was in service, a feeling of love and contentment happened as though I were taking care of a dear friend. There was a detachment from anxiety, and a feeling of abundance arose. I was amazed that in doing service I actually received more than I felt I gave.

Since that time I have been the Literature person and the Intergroup Representative. To have literature and tapes available supported the struggling debtor. To offer service at the Intergroup level has allowed me to not only serve my home meeting but also to connect to the larger DA community. Both positions have given me much more than the time and effort to do the service have required. That doing service would benefit <u>me</u> was both unexpected and a heart filled experience.

I also learned that even if not holding an "official" service position, that sharing at a meeting, setting up the meeting room or clearing the chairs afterward is of service to others in a meaningful way. Witnessing another's share is being of service to them. Thank you DA for opening my eyes to the benefits of service both to myself and to others.

I he disease of debting is an emotional illness, with a physical symptom, which requires a spiritual solution.

Service is a spiritual action and essential to the spiritual solution to the disease of debting.

"Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to other compulsive debtors and to practice these principles in all our affairs".

I would like to put in a pitch for sponsoring as spiritual service.

Sponsors have provided me with a safe relationship where I can be honest with someone who supports my spiritual recovery. I take my messes to my sponsor and my messages to the meeting. This intimacy is what I was seeking in my debting compulsion, a spiritual connection. Nothing rings more true to me than a person sharing from their own personal experience. When listening to other debtors who I can identify with, I often receive a

message which I feel is coming from my Higher Power through that person's share. On the other hand, in sponsoring another, I often hear myself saying the very words I myself need to hear. Another great benefit is that sometimes my Higher Power intervenes with a program call from a sponsee when I am facing temptation to slip. The timing is amazing! Sponsoring provides emotional and spiritual satisfaction that no amount of spending can fulfill.
