

The Seemingly Impossible has Become Possible

In giving more than 200 pressure relief meetings, I've been amazed to discover that many D.A. members don't think about saving at all. I always suggest saving as an important, eminently sane aspect of recovery, because of the powerful impact even small amounts saved regularly can have on our prosperity.

Before D.A., I experienced the horrors of compound interest spinning wildly out of control at 29.9 percent, leaving me deeper and deeper in debt. But compound interest can be just as powerful on the positive side, giving me a prosperous life out of proportion to my actual income, through a program of regular saving. Before D.A., I never imagined it was possible to save for anything. But the seemingly impossible has become possible. I accumulated a \$5,000 prudent reserve simply by saving \$10 a week and letting the interest compound for 6 years in a money market account. I've switched from a "debting lifestyle" (in which I paid large amounts in interest to use other people's money to buy things I couldn't afford) to a savings lifestyle, in which banks and credit unions pay me interest for keeping my cash in their vaults while I save for the things I want. Compound interest can either destroy me or make me prosperous, depending on how I use it.

Today I operate on a cash basis, saving slowly and methodically in several different categories for short-, medium-, and long term goals. The practice of regular saving, combined with not incurring any unsecured debt one day at a time, has made me more prosperous, more fulfilled, and more grateful than I ever had any hope of being before I came to Debtors Anonymous.

I have learned through DA that when I move out of vagueness and gain clarity about what I want or need, miracles happen. This is one such miracle.

Due to a traumatic accident and a disability that affected my concentration, I was enormously afraid of driving. I haven't driven in years, but I feel deprived. I talked to my doctor. My disability had healed enough for me to consider taking professional driving lessons to learn about defensive driving and safety issues.

To be clear about the cost of such lessons, I called several

places. The fee was close to \$1000! This amount was definitely NOT in my spending plan so I joked to my Higher Power "If I'm going to get driver's lessons, the \$1000 will just have to drop out of the sky because I can't afford it!"

The next day, I got a card with a picture of a bird's eye view looking down on a beautiful landscape. Inside was a note that said in the voice of a little bird, "I fl ew over from Inverness to Oakland and flew to your building to drop off this letter because that's where Bea said it belonged." Included in the note was a check for \$1000!

Because of my fear around driving, I thought that maybe I would take the money and get a sofa instead of driving lessons. The next day the same friend called, told me that she was giving away her sofa and did I want it? Now I have that sofa, and it is the exact style I had been thinking about!

When I am specific about what I need, it appears. With clarity, miracles happen.

Patent Pending

I'm deeply grateful to my Higher Power for DA. The support, love and guidance I have received is richer than I could ever have imagined. I'd like to share some recent miracles of the last two weeks.

I had an idea 8 years ago that, prior to DA, I had been unable to act on. In DA I began to talk about the invention and to admit that it was important to me. Last March, I fi led a provisional patent application, a PPA. This fi ling secured the invention but had a downside as well. If I didn't follow-up with a patent application within one year of the PPA filing, I would lose all rights to the invention. I'd given myself a deadline for something that felt quite beyond me. In the past I had self-sabotaged things that were connected to my dreams.

Filing an actual patent is a much more complex process than filing a PPA. The date was fast approaching. In the last year, two inventors had crossed my path, but I was discouraged. I had decided it wasn't worth it. The process felt too overwhelming. I decided to let it go. Recently I've been driving a new DA friend to a meeting. I confided in her about the patent. She gently urged me to go forward with it. She pointed out the coincidence of my crossing paths with two inventors.

Then a friend I hadn't heard from in a while called me and in passing asked about the patent. I said I wasn't going to follow up on it. I didn't think It would work out. It was too much money. He asked if a check would help. If I make a profit I could pay him back. If not, it was a gift. I've grown to trust my experience in the program and felt his sudden presence and gesture to be a miracle. It was exactly a week before the date the PPA would expire.

There were difficulties getting the patent software. I went to a meeting and spoke about the impending deadline, the auspicious

help from my friend, about the importance of the idea. I chided myself.

After the meeting a man came to me and said he wrote patents. The deadline was tight, but he'd take a look at what I had. He usually didn't go to the office on Saturdays, but this Saturday he would be there, and we could meet. He typed out the patent on the spot. I left with a fleshed out patent. I had only to insert, at various points, my provisional patent. He told me what forms to use and the total amount of the fees, which adding up to the exact amount on the check my friend had given me! I love it. The details. The numbers.

Through DA I've been able to stay open to my visions. Whether or not anything comes from the patent I feel so blessed to have received the help, love and friendship of this program.

I had been told all my life that I was dumb because I had learning defects, and they didn't know anything about that when I was growing up back in the '60s. I could not add two plus two, and I didn't think I could ever grasp the meat of the program. With the help of my PRG and talking to many people and seeing how they did the program, I finally got the courage to try it. After a few years, I really got good at it.

I belong to another 12 step program. One of my meetings was in need of a treasurer, and I was nominated. I did this successfully for several years because the meeting was going through some changes, and there was no one else there to take on the position. I then served on this programs Intergroup and was asked to be a treasurer. I instantly said "no" because I could not add. Well, the way my higher power works, about a year later, I was at another Intergroup meeting and again they needed a treasurer. I prayed to my HP and asked him to show me the way. At the very next meeting, when the topic of needing a treasurer came up, my hand went up. I was shocked, and I took a big gulp. I successfully did that treasury for 1 1/2 years and was thanked when I was done for doing such a good job.

This gave me the courage to do treasury for a DA group, and again that went very well.

Today I have no problem with doing someone else's money because I can understand what I am doing. And if I don't, today I know how to ask for help rather than trying to fi gure it out myself.

Other services I do in DA, are PRGs. I have two for myself because I am a business owner, and I also have a personal one. I then give PRGs. Right now I am doing about 6 PRGs and every once in a while I give a one timer for someone. I also sponsor a few people, and I find that sponsoring and being a sponsee, is a win-win situation. I always get more than I give in these situations.

Last night at my Sunday night meeting, we read the pamphlet on service, and it mentioned about being almost addicted to doing service. That is something that I must look at constantly. If I start doing too much service, and I start to build up resentments, then I better stop and take a look at what I am doing wrong and set about to correct it. That usually means that I am people pleasing, which is one of my character defects. I then get to make an amends and correct the wrong I have made. I am very grateful for the lessons I have learned in DA and am no longer afraid of money.

As in all 12 Step work, you need not be struggling on your own; I will always be here to help you if you ask, and others too. Talk to your PRG and your Sponsor, pray and listen.
